How are applications made?

How does the Ministry of Energy and Mines review applications?

The Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources refer applications to the Regional District and other agencies for comments and recommendations. It is important to make an appointment with

Planning Staff at the Regional District prior to submitting an application to the Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources. Staff will outline the Regional District policies that will be considered when a referral of the application is received from the Ministry.

The Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources may or may not require the applicant to undertake public notification.

How do Regional District policies affect an application?

The Regional District reviews applications in light of regulations, policies, and local issues such as environmental quality, neighbourhood characteristics, transportation and access.

Official Community Plans are documents containing policies that guide decisions about future land use. These policies are considered when reviewing applications for sand and/or gravel extraction.

Where permanent buildings or processing are being proposed in addition to the extraction,

the Regional District may request that a zoning amendment application be completed. A rezoning application cannot be required where only extraction is proposed.

Summary of Steps in a Sand & Gravel Extraction Referral

Application made with the Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources

Application may be referred to the Regional District

There may be a referral to the Regional District and other relevant agencies.

Application referral reviewed

Regional District Staff are asked to provide comments on the proposal. Planning Staff then prepares a report to the Regional Board.

The Regional Board considers the application

The Regional Board may indicate to the Ministry:

- Support for the application,
- Support for the application with certain conditions,
- Defer making a recommendation,
- No support for the application.

Response to the application

The Regional Board recommendation and the Community Services Department report is forwarded for the consideration of the Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources.

Ministry considers the application

The Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources makes a decision on the application and notifies the applicant.
