BY-LAW NO. 270

---

Being a By-law to Provide for Remuneration of Directors and Alternate Directors

---

WHEREAS Section 788 of the Municipal Act R.S.B.C. 1979 authorizes the Regional Board by by-law to provide for remuneration of Directors and Alternate Directors.

AND WHEREAS Sub-section (2) of Section 788 of the Municipal Act, R.S.B.C. 1979 provides that a Director or Alternate Director be paid reasonable expenses incurred in connection with his/her attendance at Regional Board meetings and those expenses while engaging in business of the Regional District.

NOW THEREFORE THE REGIONAL BOARD OF THE REGIONAL DISTRICT OF CENTRAL OKANAGAN IN OPEN MEETING ASSEMBLED, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:


1. That the Regional Board Directors and Alternate Directors of the Regional District of Central Okanagan shall receive remuneration for services rendered.
2. That the said remuneration shall be determined annually or from time to time by resolution of the Regional Board of the said Regional District.
3. That one-third of the Regional Board Directors' remuneration is paid as an allowance for expenses incidental to the discharge of the duties of office.
4. That By-law #248, 1983 cited as the "Regional District of Central Okanagan Board of Directors' Remuneration By-law" is hereby repealed.
5. That this by-law may be cited as the "Regional District of Central Okanagan Board of Directors' Remuneration By-law No. 270 , 1984.
