

REGIONAL DISTRICT OF CENTRAL OKANAGAN

BYLAW NO. 954

A bylaw to authorize the Regional District of Central Okanagan to dispose of park land identified as 'Park' on Lot 8, Plan 43094, D.L. 2599, ODYD, located on Shannon Place, Westbank, B.C., dedicated by subdivision, and to place the proceeds of the disposal to the credit of a reserve fund established for the purpose of acquiring future park lands.

WHEREAS pursuant to subsection 176 (d) of the *Local Government Act* a regional district is authorized to acquire, hold, manage and dispose of land, improvements, personal property or other property, and any interest or right in or with respect to that property;

AND WHEREAS pursuant to Section 798, 'Exchange of dedicated land', a regional district must provide a counter petition opportunity in relation to the disposal of park land;

AND WHEREAS the Regional Board of the Regional District of Central Okanagan has directed that the Regional District dispose of park land dedicated by subdivision identified as 'Park' on Lot 8, Plan 43094, D.L. 2599, ODYD, located on Shannon Place Park, Westbank, B.C., subject to assent of the electors by counter petition;

NOW THEREFORE, the Regional Board of the Regional District of Central Okanagan in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

1. Subject to seeking assent of the electors of Electoral Area 'G' and Electoral Area 'Westbank' by counter petition, the Board of the Regional District of Central Okanagan is hereby authorized and empowered to dispose of park land dedicated by subdivision identified as 'Park' on Lot 8, Plan 43094, D.L. 2599, ODYD, outlined on attached map forming part of this bylaw.
2. The amount of liability created by this bylaw is nil.
3. The Director of Corporate Services and Chairperson are hereby authorized to execute all documents necessary to carry out the disposition of the park land authorized by this bylaw.
4. This bylaw may be cited as "Regional District of Central Okanagan Westside Parks Surplus - Shannon Place Park Bylaw No. 954, 2001".

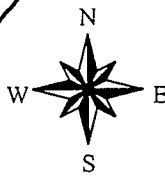
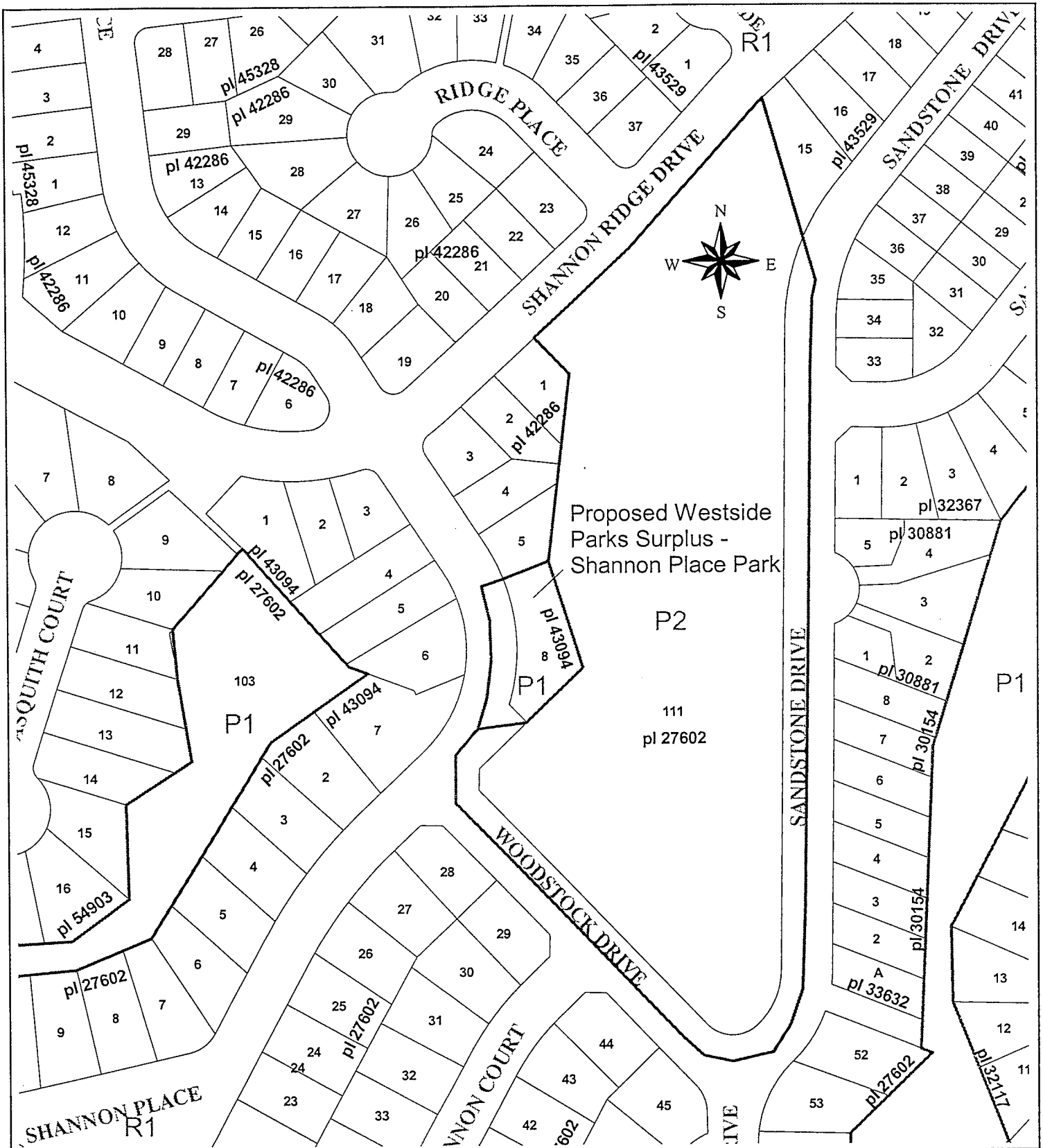
