

The LUC Discharge & Rezoning/OCP Amendment Process

Review of Proposal

Relevant agencies, Regional District departments, and applicable public Advisory Commissions are asked to review the submission and provide comments. When comments have been compiled, staff will prepare a report to the Regional Board.



Public Notification

Prior to the Public Hearing the Regional District notifies the community through ads and letters.



Consideration of 1st Reading by the Regional Board

At first reading the Regional Board may:

- not approve the bylaws,
- defer and request more information, or
- give first reading to the bylaws. The Regional Board may require certain conditions be met before setting a date for the public hearing.



Public Hearing

A public hearing provides the opportunity for the public to present their comments to the Regional Board.



Consideration of 2nd and 3rd Readings by the Regional Board

The Regional Board may:

- not approve the bylaws, or
- give further reading(s) to the bylaws. The Regional Board may require that certain conditions be met prior to further consideration.



Consideration of Adoption

This is the last step in the process. Adoption means that the amendments are officially changed.
